Today I am visiting the Bank of Canada Museum, where I will explore and learn things about money!




I know I have arrived at the Museum when I see the large glass pyramid.



Once inside, I can use the elevator or the stairs to find my way to the desk where a staff member will greet me.









The staff will then hand me a special bracelet that I can put around my wrist. The bracelet helps me explore the Museum. It's okay if I don't want to wear the bracelet.



The staff at the Museum are very friendly and can answer my questions.








The Museum has a few rules that help us stay safe and have fun. I will try to follow these rules:

I can touch screens to find out more about money.




I can make my own bank note.



I can watch a movie in the theatre.




Some exhibits have bright lights and make sounds. I can borrow things like headphones or sunglasses to wear while I visit. I can also ask to go to a quiet place if I need to.






If I feel tired, I can find a seat and rest.
